

THERE ARE MANY EFFECTIVE WAYS to find internships. The most successful internship-seekers devote time and energy to search using a variety of strategies and refuse to give up if at first they don't find what they're looking for. Below are some proven ways to locate internship opportunities.

TALK TO PEOPLE

Contacts

- > **Fact** - 48% of respondents to our recent graduate survey reported that relationships with others – personal, professional, or academic contacts – directly helped them get their position.
- > **Advice** - Tell your friends and family members what you're looking for and ask them to keep an eye out for you.

Internship Fair & Other Career Fairs

- > **Fact** - 72% of employer respondents to our Internship Fair Hiring Survey indicated they extended an internship offer to a UW student they met at the 2016 Internship Fair.
- > **Advice** - Commit to attending at least one of the 20+ internship and/or career fairs at UW this year.

Other Employer Events

- > **Fact** - The Career & Internship Center hosted 52 employer visibility events in 2015-2016.
- > **Advice** - Check our online calendar for Meet the Employer Sessions, Employer-Led Workshops, and Careers-In Employer Panels.

USE CAMPUS RESOURCES

HuskyJobs

- > **Fact** - Employers posted 1,716 internships in HuskyJobs last year! 80% of them were paid!
- > **Advice** - Log in to your HuskyJobs account at careers.uw.edu, set up your profile, and do some keyword searches in the *Internship/Learning Experience* section.

Academic Departments

- > **Fact** - More than 40 academic departments offer internship courses and even more than that provide students with internship resources and advice.
- > **Advice** - Find out how your department disseminates internship information – listserves, blogs, Facebook, bulletin boards, etc.

Carlson Leadership & Public Service Center

- > **Fact** - The Carlson Center is a great resource for students interested in non-profit and public sector internships.
- > **Advice** - Peruse their Public Service Opportunities Bulletin and look into their Undergraduate Community-Based Internship Program.

Keyword Searches

- > Open a browser, type “internship”, and then type something else like an industry, a city, etc.
- > Ex: “marketing internship Boston”

TIPS:

- > **Be patient.** Finding the right opportunity usually takes a little time. Stay positive!
